Student Pilot Licence — requirements

Before starting airborne training, all ground school subjects must be passed and an SPL obtained.

- ✓ Must be 16 years of age
- ✓ Must hold a Class 2 medical, plus a photocopy to leave at CAAZ
- ✓ Proficient in English — a pass of C or higher at O Level is recommended
- ✓ Pay the appropriate fee to CAAZ
- ✓ 2 passport photos

Health

One must be in good general health. Corrected eyesight may be acceptable, providing the student always carries a spare set of glasses when airborne.

Ground school & examinations

Our ground school provides a solid practical and theoretical knowledge base exceeding the level required by the Civil Aviation Authority of Zimbabwe (CAAZ), helping students become safer, more decisive pilots.

Training is delivered through an online virtual classroom and may begin at any time. Five, four-week classroom courses run each year for subject recapping, Q&A and practical radio telephony training — giving maximum flexibility to students who can't attend an orthodox school system.

Ground school fee: US\$1,500.00 — non-refundable, includes all learning materials, online access and classroom time. Must be completed within 12 months, or the fee is payable again.

Airborne training

Airborne training is conducted using Guthrie Aviation's Cessna 172s — one of the world's most popular training aircraft. The legal minimum is 40 hours, though experience shows an average student requires up to 50 hours (or more, depending on the student).

If you're unsure about starting your training, try an introductory flight for US\$190. Enrolments are conducted Monday–Friday, 0800–1300.
